IMPACT OF COVID -19 PANDEMIC IN NIGERIA

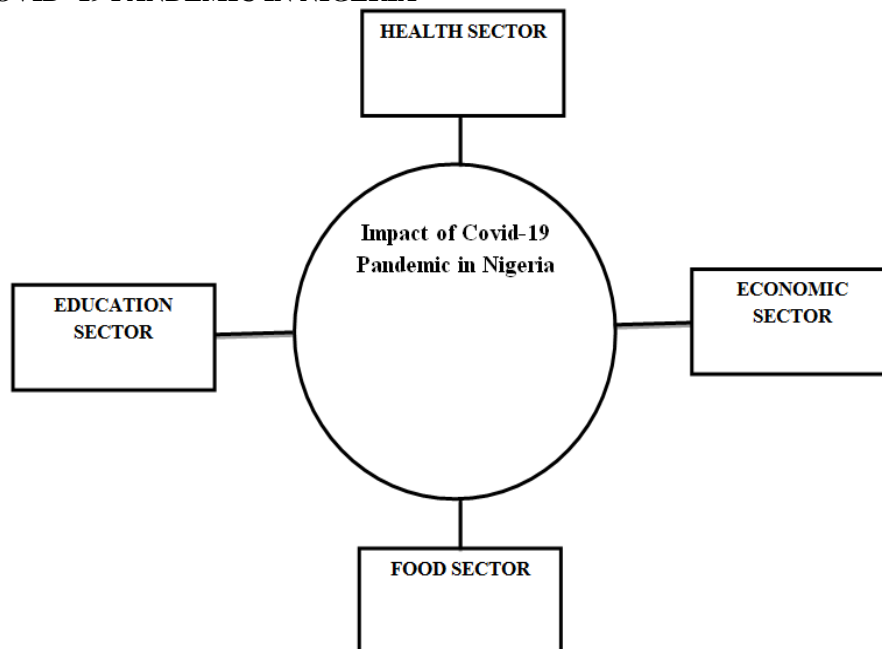


Figure 1: Some impact of Corona Virus Pandemic in Nigeria.
